Miniwaste
Miniwaste is a three-year project (January 2010-December 2012), co-funded by the LIFE+ programme of the European Commission. It aims to demonstrate, in accordance with the recent Waste Framework Directive 2008/98/EC, that it is possible to significantly reduce the amount of organic waste (food and green waste) at the source in a mastered and sustainable way, and to monitor actions for waste reduction in an efficient and helpful manner.

Pre-waste
Pre-waste is a three-year European project (2010-2012) whose aim is to help cities and regions to improve their waste prevention policies, in order to significantly reduce waste production and hazardousness. The project will in particular deliver waste prevention best practices implemented in Europe, indicators and monitoring tools and guidelines for planning and implementing waste prevention programmes at local or regional level. Pre-waste is co-funded by the INTERREG IV C programme.

PURE (Project on Urban Reduction of Eutrophication)
The project PURE (Project on Urban Reduction of Eutrophication) implements one of the most cost effective and quickest ways to tackle eutrophication: it enhances phosphorus removal at selected municipal wastewater treatment plants in the Baltic Sea region. PURE partner water utilities aim to achieve an average annual concentration of 0.5 mg phosphorus / litre in outgoing wastewaters. This is the level recommended by [the HELCOM Baltic Sea Action Plan](#) to reach a good environmental status of the sea. The project is co-financed by the Baltic Sea Region Program 2007-2013.
